I talked with the elders at the two congregations where I held meetings about our project to send 5,000 NKJV New Testaments to Africa this fall and the two congregations gave \$1,000.00 each for this project. Also one other congregation gave \$100.00 for the New Testaments and another congregation said they will also help. The second meeting was at the Klang congregation. These brethren had been renovating the church building and putting in a new sound system. The building looked very nice.



Friday before the last meeting started I got sick and was able to preach but had to cancel the last teacher's workshop which was to be for two night sessions. I thought I had Malaria from the Africa trip but after finally getting some blood work discovered that it was not Malaria.




We were able to recruit a few teachers for our BCC program and hopefully pick up some new students while we were there. We had the opportunity to study with a man who is not a Christian and he came one night during the meeting. We also got to visit in the home of one of our BCC students and we had a good visit with her and her family. She came with her husband and son one night to the meeting also. We enjoyed our trip to Malaysia and getting to visit and teach for the congregations that we have been able to work with in the past. The brethren there face many challenges living in a Moslem country that we know very little about. They need our prayers and encouragement.

#### **Our Visit to China**

During the last few days of our trip we flew from Malaysia to Shanghai, China. We were visiting one of our former students who lived in Cookeville for two years. She now resides in Shanghai and teaches at a high school there.

I was thinking about the population of some of the cities we visited and passed through on this trip. Going over we landed in Seoul, South Korea which has 20,550,000 people. On our return we landed in Tokyo, Japan which has 32,450,000. We stayed in Shanghai, China which has around 25 million people. China has about 1.3 billion people. Perhaps no one really knows the true population of China because it is against the law to have more than one child with very large fines for having a second child. For this reason many in the rural areas have children at home but do not report the birth of the child. There are about 100 known New Testament Christians in Shanghai. It is against the law there for the Lord's Church to meet so they must meet in low profile. For obvious reasons we will not go into any details about the church there and who they are and where they meet. The city of Shanghai with its 25 million is about the same in population as the states of Tennessee, Kentucky, Alabama and Georgia combined living in one city. These states in the USA have a combined membership of about 340,000 Christians while Shanghai has about 100.

Travel in Shanghai was very difficult for us since we do not speak the language. We met some very nice people and gave information to them about our web page and John Grubb's web page which is in Chinese. Some have sent emails thanking us for giving the web page information.

Our thanks to those who helped with the expenses for this mission trip. Please continue to pray for our efforts to take the Gospel of Christ "into all the world". As we draw near to the end of the year we are looking for congregations to consider putting our work into their monthly budget. We need your help in our work.

In our Newsletter we reported that we have over 5,700 BCC students from 151 nations and that is a lot of people but just looking at the number is impersonal. However, when you consider that one of these students is a very nice lady named Belle with a wonderful family and you get the chance to visit with her and her family that makes it very personal. Each of these 5,700 BCC students like Belle have families and many friends. If our BCC program can reach some of these and teach them more about the blessed Gospel of Christ and they in turn can teach their family members and friends just think of the impact this can have for the cause of Christ around the world.

We are happy to have over 5,700 BCC students but very happy to know one of them and to have been able to become friends with this good family.

We are also happy to have so many hard-working, dedicated teachers with our online study program. It really would not work without them.

It's the season for giving thanks and we are thankful for everyone involved in the work of IBTM.

#### **Projects We Are Working on This Fall**

We are seeking to get several things done now for our 2013 trip to Zambia. We are raising funds to:

- Print and ship 5,000 Tonga Songbooks to Zambia
- Purchase and ship 5,000 NKJV New Testaments
- Print and ship 100,000 Gospel tracts to different locations in Africa
- Purchase and ship textbooks to the preacher training school in Siamafumba, Zambia

The total cost for these projects will be around \$18,600. We will be sending out letters in the next few weeks and the songbooks are being printed now. We have ordered 3,000 of the New Testaments already and hope to ship them by the end of the year.

Another project is raising funds to build a new church building at the preacher training school in Siamafumba, Zambia. We have already given \$2,500 to the brethren there and the project is under way. Special thanks go to our brother Earl Alverson for his help in raising funds for this church building. He has already raised about one third of the \$15,000 needed to build this church building. We appreciate Earl and his help with this and other projects.
