

Dear brethren,

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. The Lord is greatly blessing our work around the world. We are seeing many souls brought to the Lord and new schools of preaching established training faithful Gospel preachers in many places. As I write this Newsletter we are preparing for a trip to Tanzania, Uganda and Kenya in January. In Tanzania we will be working with Tanzania School of Biblical Studies. During the past few years we have been able to purchase 30 acres of land for the preacher school, church and a school for orphans. Currently there is a new church building and a staff house and a well on the property. Willy Yudah and his good wife have started a Christian school for orphans. They have just completed the first year with about 40 children finishing pre-school and are now ready to start grade one. So next year they will have pre-school and grade one. They hope to add one new grade per year. Willy's wife and some other good Christian ladies are doing the teaching at the school. Willy has the opportunity to preach to family members of the children. Currently they are meeting in a house but hopefully one day we can help build a building for these precious little children who are in need of so many things. However, their greatest need is being met in that they are being taught the truths from God's Word each day.

After Tanzania we plan to meet up with bro. Jerry Sullins in Uganda. The East Africa School of Biblical Studies is in a new building and they will be starting with a new group of students. They are hoping to have 25 men at the school in January. We will be there working with Jerry as he gets the school there started with new students. We also plan to visit 2 different preacher schools in Kenya that we are helping and to meet with faithful brethren who have a desire to start a new preacher school in the Great Rift Valley. We plan to visit with 5 different preacher schools on this trip.

Last month we reported on 6 projects we were working on. The funds to finish the new school building at Ngwezi have been sent and the building is now complete and ready for new students in January. The funds to finish the church building at Siamafumba are now raised and the work we hope will soon be done. We still are in need of around \$8,000.00 for the staff house-class room for the school in Solwezi, Zambia. We also mentioned we are seeking to raise funds to purchase 10 motor bikes for teachers at different preacher schools so they can travel from their homes to the schools. Most of these men are older men and find it difficult to ride bicycles for several miles. These motor bikes will cost about \$1,500.00 each and we have raised funds for 2 motor bikes.

Since our last Newsletter we have shipped 59 boxes of good books to different preacher schools in Africa. Currently we are getting 200,000 Gospel tracts printed. Our thanks to Garland Robinson for his help in printing so many materials for us and helping us keep the cost greatly reduced to just paper and ink. He is a great blessing to our work.

We are looking for congregations or individuals who would like to support or help support a preacher school in Africa. We currently have helped to start 6 faithful preacher schools that are in need of monthly support. These schools range in needs from \$300.00 per month to \$800.00 per month. We would ask that faithful congregations and individuals here in the USA consider putting one of these schools in your budget for 2017 and help us to train faithful Gospel preachers in Africa so they can lead many souls to the truth of God's Word. Brethren, we need your help with these schools of Preaching.

As our work continues to grow our need for more funds continues to grow. Please consider putting our work at IBTM in your budget for 2017. Thanks for your support and your prayers. Please continue to help us as you can to take the Gospel of Christ, *"into all the world"*.
