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Dear brethren,

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord Jesus. We are off to a great start in the new year. During the month of January we were able to send 5,000 Tonga song books to Zambia, 50,000 Gospel tracts in two different African languages and over 494 books to preacher training schools. We received \$850.00 from the New Hope Rd church of Christ which was funds given to the Jimmie B. Hill Memorial Library Fund and we were able to purchase 45 text books, most of these were books pertaining to Greek. These text books were sent to Siamafumba School of Biblical Studies in Zambia, Africa. We plan to use the funds that are given to this memorial library fund to purchase text books and books for preacher training school libraries and place them there in memory of Jimmie. We also encourage anyone who would like to place books in these schools in memory of any of their loved ones to send funds and we will send the books. What better way to remember a faithful Christian than to place books in preacher school libraries and class rooms for text book use. We have a nice color label we will use in the front of the books with your loved one's name mentioned there. We can use individual books or books that come in sets. Any amount from \$20.00 upward can be used. Anyone sending funds for books in memory of their loved ones will receive a letter informing them of the books that were sent and where they were sent.

We are also working on our mission trip to Malaysia & Singapore which will be in April. Carolyn & I plan to be there for the month of April . I will be conducting Gospel meetings and teaching workshops. Carolyn will be teaching ladies. We always enjoy working with the fine brethren in Malaysia. We have been trying to ship Bible class materials to several congregations in Malaysia and Singapore as well. We are looking forward to this trip. Please keep us in your prayers that we might be able to do much good and be safe. In January we enrolled 4 new students in our Distance Learning Program. During the past few days we sent out our annual fundraising letter for our mission trip to Zambia, Africa each August. For those of you who are new at receiving our Newsletter we try to raise funds for our "Work Fund" which comes in on a monthly basis. However, once each year we try to do several things for the work in Africa which is above and beyond our monthly work. These projects require extra funds. Our thanks to congregations and individuals who have been so good to help with this good work. These extra funds allow us to do many wonderful things for the cause of Christ in Zambia and other places in Africa.

Other projects we hope to be able to accomplish in Africa include the following:
