Dear brethren.

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. I am thankful to God that I can report that I am doing much better with my health. I am now walking with the use of a cane and back in my office each day working. I still have a way to go before getting back to where I was before GBS hit me. Carolyn & I want to thank those who have sent cards and extended phone calls to us letting us know you are praying for us. You will never know how much this has meant to us and please continue to keep us in prayer that I might have a full recovery and be able soon to be back in the mission fields.

Our Malawi-Zambia mission trip is going on as I write this Newsletter. Please keep Rusty & Laura Stark and Barry & Jodie Gilreath in your prayers as they are currently in Africa.

As our funds increase our ability to do good work for the Lord increases also. Below is a list of some of the things your funds have helped to accomplish during the past few months:

- 1. Finish the new preacher school/church building/dorm for students/ class for orphan children in Tanzania.
- 2. Purchase land for a new preacher school in Solwezi, Zambia. We are waiting for building permits and bids.
- 3. New school at Ngwezi completed with new bathrooms finished.
- 4. Church building at Siamafumba completed on outside.
- 5. Sent \$5,000.00 for drought victims for food.
- 6. Printed and shipped 200,000 Gospel tracts
- 7. Printed and shipped several thousand BCC booklets.
- 8. Helped purchase new school van in Uganda at Preacher school.
- 9. Gave funds toward helping build 6 different church buildings in Africa.
- 10. Purchased 5 motor bikes for instructors at preacher schools in Africa.
- 11. Supporting 7 different preacher schools in Africa.
- 12. Shipped thousands of books, Bibles to Africa
- 13. Made another mission trip to Malaysia & Singapore.

Currently we are in need of finding churches or individuals to support 3 of the preacher schools we are currently working with. These schools need \$500.00 each per month. We plan to start soon on replacing the roof on the staff house that was destroyed by a storm at the school in Tanzania. The director of the school and his wife and son were living in the house when the storm struck. Willy was injured some when bricks fell on him and his wife was injured the most causing her to lose their unborn second child. Willy's wife Scola teaches about 50 orphan children at the church building each day. These children are from ages 3 to 5 and Scola and helpers are doing a great job with these children. Willy and Scola are currently living in a small one room storage building at the school. We hope to have the house repaired soon so they can get moved back into it.

We have also just wired the funds to purchase 6 acres of land in Lilongwe, Malawi where the new preacher school there is currently renting a house. They are doing a great work there training Gospel preachers. Barry & Jodie Gilreath just finished a Friday- Sunday Gospel meeting there that was organized by our brethren there. They had over 5,000 in attendance with 55 baptisms and 15 restored. Many from Mozambique also came for this meeting. We hope to start next year building the new school building in Lilongwe.

As you can see the work continues to go forward and many good things are happening around the world for the cause of Christ. One of the greatest needs in the world is the need for more faithful Gospel preachers. Currently in the preacher schools we are working with in Africa there are over 125 preachers enrolled in these schools. Some will graduate this year and others will graduate in 2018. But within the next year 125 new Gospel preachers will take their place with different churches of Christ in Africa preaching and
