Dear brethren,

Greetings to you all in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. On Monday August 4, 2014, 8 Christians left from 5 different cities and met up in Chicago for this mission trip. Rusty & Laura Stark started from Chicago. Rusty &

Laura are veteran missionaries and always a pleasure to work with. Barry Gilreath, Jr. departed from Florence, AL. Barry has made several trips with us to Zambia. Barry is a good man to have on mission trips and we enjoy working with him. This year Barry brought his daughter Hannah and nephew Seth Weaver to Zambia. These 2 young Christians are college students and they were a joy to work with and to get to know. Also joining us on this trip was Charlie Hannah from Pikeville, TN. In addition to preaching Charlie helps teach counseling classes with ICOTB. He also taught some classes in Zambia on counseling. We had a great team of Christian men & women to work with on this trip.

We arrived in Livingstone, Zambia on Wednesday August 6<sup>th</sup>. After a day and a half to get ready we departed on Friday

August 8<sup>th</sup> for our first meeting and trip to the bush. This meeting was at the Misika congregation, where several graduates of preacher schools live and work. One of the local brethren there opened his house for us to stay which is a big improvement from the past where we slept in straw huts or on the floor of the church building. We slept in real beds! During our first day at Misika we had 802 present and on Saturday 918 and the largest crowd for the meeting on Sunday of 1,012 in attendance. There were 29 baptisms and 60 restored during this meeting. During the afternoon sessions we divided up in classes, Rusty taught a men's class, Laura taught a ladies class, Seth taught a teen class, Hannah taught a children's class and I taught a class of ICOTB students. Coming back from Misika we had a breakdown and were delayed several hours and finally one vehicle had to tow the other. We arrived back in Livingstone around 9:00PM to find we had no power and no hot water. It was also too late to go out and get any dinner so we had snacks.

The next day we began teaching classes at Zambia School of Biblical Studies in Livingstone. We taught classes on Matthew, Acts and Christian counseling. The men also took turns speaking in chapel each morning.

On Thursday August 14<sup>th</sup> Rusty & Laura and Carolyn & I along with Webby & Jane departed for our second trip to the bush at Siamafumba. Webby is one of the instructors at ZSOBS a very fine Gospel Preacher and a good mechanic. Barry, Seth, Charlie and Hannah stayed at Livingstone to teach and speak in chapel as they were also scheduled to return back to the USA that weekend. We planned to depart Livingstone that morning at 8:00AM, but due to getting some work done on the van it was 1:30PM when we departed. In Africa you must learn to be flexible things don't always go as you plan. We arrived by way of one of the many "short cuts" around 5:30PM. I met with the 5 instructors at Siamafumba School of Biblical Studies and gave them the funds

send by the Rock Valley congregation for operation of the school for six months and funds to finish the new church building that was under construction there as well. Then we began our preaching sessions.

While we were at Siamafumba we also had an ICOTB graduation. The 5 instructors there at the preacher training school each received their MA degree in Bible from ICOTB.

About 10:00PM that night we got around to giving Rusty & Laura their anniversary card that Carolyn had made for them. For the past several years we have had 2 celebrations during our meeting in the bush at Siamafumba, Rusty & Laura's anniversary and Carolyn's birthday. On Saturday we had 1,084 in attendance and Sunday there were 1,315 present. There were 17 baptisms and 45 restorations during the meeting. People from 68 different congregations were present for the meeting. We provided 2 lap top computers for the school, several suits, ties and other items. Each of the 7 men who will graduate in November got a new bike and the 5 instructors also got new bikes for their travel back and forth from their homes to the school. Next year the brethren at SSOBS hope to take in 20 new students at the school.

After the meeting on Sunday we drove back to Livingstone in about 3 and one half hours with no breakdowns. When we

arrived back in Livingstone we were tired, dirty and hungry and again we had no water! On Monday we were back to our schedule of teaching at ZSOBS in Livingstone.

On Thursday August 21<sup>st</sup>, Carolyn & I along with Webby & Jane started out on a very long trip to Solwezi in the Copper belt. We drove 2 hard days, 16 hours the first day over some of the worst roads you can imagine. We arrived on Friday the 22<sup>nd</sup>. around midnight. There are 4 brethren there who plan to start a preacher training school in Solwezi opening in 2015. We gave them a lap top computer for the school and took several suits and ties and other items for them. We gave them funds to purchase 10 tables for the school and a book case for the books we have sent them and more we plan to send. Each of the 4 instructors there also received a bike for transportation. We also were able to purchase some Bibles in the local languages there. We purchases 20 in Luvale, 32 in Kaonde and 20 in Lunda at a cost of \$742.00.



This was certainly not the worst road we drove on this trip but it was typical of driving conditions.

We are in need of finding a church that is willing to help sponsor the preacher school in Solwezi. The school plans to start with a budget of \$500.00 per month. I hope there is a congregation that reads this that would like to get involved in training Gospel preachers in Africa and can help with part or all of this monthly amount for this school.

While we were in Solwezi Rusty was conducting a Gospel meeting at the Highland congregation back in Livingstone. They had 1 baptism and 4 restored during the meeting.

On Sunday August 24<sup>th</sup> we departed Solwezi headed for Mbeye, Tanzania. This was also a long hard trip. We arrived in Mbeya on Wednesday August 27<sup>th</sup> just after midnight. We had a very hard time getting across the border on the Tanzania side. It seemed that many of the border officials were looking for a bribe and delayed us in every way they could, but no bribes were paid! There were police check points at the entrance of just about every small town and more than once the police tried to get a bribe from us. It is sad to see such corruption among the police and government officials.

One lady came forward stating she had learned that she had been baptized for the wrong reason and that she was in the wrong church! It is very encouraging to see people with good honest hearts willing to change when they learn the truth of God's Word! Willy Yudah and 2 other faithful preachers are conducting a preacher

training school there and is doing a great work. We gave funds to provide bikes for the 3 instructors there at the school. We are sending books, Bibles, tracts and other materials for the school there. We gave them funds to purchase desks for the school and supplies such as notebooks, pens and other needed items.

On Friday August 29<sup>th</sup> about 1:30 PM we started our long trip back to Livingstone. It took 2 days of hard driving to get back to Livingstone. We stopped in Lusaka trying to purchase Tonga Bibles. The Bible Society had no Tonga Bibles but said they would have them by September 20<sup>th</sup>. We left \$2,000.00 with the men at ZSOBS and they will go to Lusaka and get them when they are back in print. When we arrived back in Livingstone Rusty & Laura had returned back to the USA. On Sunday August 31<sup>st</sup> I spoke at the Highland congregation and there were 3 baptized into Christ. The next day we spent getting ready to return back home.

On Tuesday September 2<sup>nd</sup> I spoke in chapel at ZSOBS and we visited with the teachers there waiting to be taken to the airport around 11:00AM. We had a great mission trip to Zambia and Tanzania! There were 53 baptized into Christ and 109 were restored. We were able to purchase 36 bikes for preachers this year. We plan to ship the remaining NKJV New Testaments to Africa in the next few weeks. We will be shipping more hard

copies of our BCC lessons also and more books to the 10 different preacher schools we are working with.
